The Pupil Premium Grant is additional funding allocated to schools to work with children who have been registered for free school meals at any point in the last six years. Children who have been looked after continuously for more than six months and children of service personnel are also included in the

funding. The main aim of the funding is to support this group of students by providing support in school to improve their attainment and narrow the gap between them and their peers

In 2013/14 we have been allocated a total of £312,429. It includes £170,100 basic funding; £27,000 allocated specifically for Year 7 to improve Literacy and Numeracy, £101,700 for Ever 6 and an additional £13, 629.

As part of the college Improvement plan funding priority 2 we have been allocated £24,000 for intervention
