
General News

What's your favourite book of all time?


I have so, so many favourites but I'll pick *Watership Down* by Richard Adams because it was the first proper book I actually owned, a birthday prezzie when I was twelve. It's an amazing, dramatic story about a bunch of rabbits, but it had a picture of a rabbit's face on the cover and I was terrified my friends might think it was a book for little kids. (It SO isn't...) Even so, I sneaked it to school and was reading it in a quiet corner when the coolest boy in our year came up and demanded to know what it was. I'd no choice but to show him the embarrassing rabbit's-face cover, and he said, 'Watership Down is the best book I've ever read!' I made a new friend that day who loved books as much as I did, and I learned an important lesson too... reading is cool!

Who or what inspired you to write?

Ever since I can remember, I've loved creating characters and stories in my head, and writing them down was just the next step. Inspiration is everywhere, and I've yet to shake off that compulsion to invent stories! Once I realised you could actually make stories for a living, that became my dream.

If you couldn't be an author what would you be?

Libraries of the world



TIANYIGE LIBRARY, NINGBO CHINA

The library is the oldest private library still in existence in China. It was built during Emperor's Jiajing's reign in the Ming Dynasty (1561-1566 A.D.). It was formerly the private library of Fan Qin, a military minister. Fan Qin became a Jinshi scholar after the Imperial Examination at the age of 27. Later he served in many parts of the country, during which time he collected the books stored at Tianyige.

THE BIBLIOTECA DO CONVENTO DE MAFRA, MAFRA PORTUGAL

This library is 85 meters long and 9,5 meters wide, built in the form of a cross and paved with multi-coloured limestone floor and Rocaille shelves. The bookshelves contain more than 36,000 leather-bound volumes. Some rare works furnish its shelves to this day, including the Nuremberg Chronicle (1493), and other precious books such as the famous Nuremberg Chronicle and the first French encyclopaedia - known as Diderot et d'Alembert
