### EXCEPTIONAL CIRCUMSTANCES

There may be exceptional circumstances which could make you eligible for a bursary even if you do not meet the criteria. If you think this may be the case, then you will need to complete an application form and submit it, with a covering letter explaining your current circumstances.

# What is the 16-19 Bursary Fund?

Ifield Community College administers a bursary fund to support students who are aged between 16 & 19 and who experience financial difficulties or have a low household income. Eligible students could receive financial help which can then be used to buy materials/equipment for their course.

Students may also receive funding for one-off costs such as travel/bus fares or other resources in order to participate in their programme of learning.

Full confidentiality will be maintained at all times when dealing with applications.

# Who is eligible? A) Vulnerable Bursary

Up to £1200 per year for

- Young people in care
- Care leavers
- Young people themselves in receipt of Income Support/ Universal Credit (UC)
- Disabled young people in receipt of Disability Living Allowance, who are also in receipt of Employment and Support Allowance or UC

#### **B)** Discretionary Bursary

Some students will be eligible to apply for a discretionary bursary which will be individually assessed based upon

- students in receipt of free school meals or
- whose family household income is £25,000 a year or less or
- whose learning is impacted by other financial hardships

## What evidence will be required?

All applications will be financially assessed on an individual basis

To support your application, evidence will be required, such as:

- Letter or award notice confirming DWP benefits
- P60
- Evidence of annual income if self employed
- 3-6 months' worth of wage slips/bank statements

As well as the above, in order to be accepted and maintain the bursary, students are expected to:

- Have acceptable behaviour
- Maintain high levels of attendance
- Meet course requirements
- Follow 6th Form Code of Conduct
