Dear Year ten Parent,

I wrote to you on 1<sup>st</sup> June to say that we would not be offering lessons in school for year ten before September. I would like to review that decision.

Following a review of the levels of engagement of year ten students in their remote working, I have revised the plan for a return to some, limited classes and have found a way to make this safer. I am now happy to recommend this to you.

Over the half term break I asked for your views and I am grateful to the high numbers who responded. I am asking again if you would take a few moments to share your views of the new plan.

In summary, we would teach English, Maths and Science to all year ten students for one day per week each. Your child would be allocated a day to come to school for three successive one hour lessons with short breaks in between. The groups will have no more than twelve students. There would only be three groups in school per day. Each group would have a dedicated corridor with their own set of toilets and a dedicated staircase to minimise risk of transmission. The three classrooms would be thoroughly cleaned every day ready for the next day's class. There will be only three teachers involved, again reducing interaction.

This is an efficient model that does not detract from the online offer to all students and is, I believe, safe.
